Adjective 2-1: i adjectives

Present predicate adjective

Canada wa **samui** desu = Canada is cold

The adjective samui is used by itself (not modifying a noun or anything). Hence, it doesn't change at all.

Present modifier adjective

Canada wa **samui** tokoro desu = Canada is a cold place

This sentence is just like above but now the adjective samui is modifying a noun tokoro (place).

Present negative adjective

Hawaii wa samukunai desu = Hawaii is not cold

Drop the -i and add the -kunai

Past predicate adjective

Kotoshi no fuyu wa samukatta desu = This winter was cold

Drop the -i and add -katta; Note: very often the desu at the end is dropped

Past modifier adjective

Kotoshi wa **samui** fuyu deshita = This year was cold winter

Adjective samui is modifying a noun fuyu (winter)

Past negative adjective

Natsu wa samu kuna katta desu = Summer was not cold

Adjective 2-2: na adjectives

Present predicate adjective

Anata wa kirei desu = You are beautiful

The adjective kirei (beautiful) is used by itself (not modifying a noun or anything).

Present modifier adjective

Aanata wa kirei na hito desu = You are a beautiful person

The adjective kirei is modifying a noun hito (person). Therefore the **-na** is added.

Present negative adjective

Anata wa kirei dewa arimasen = You are not beautiful

Note: The **verb changes** not the adjective. Whereas with -i adjectives, the adjective changes not the verb . Example: Anata no neko wa chiisakunai desu = You cat is not small

Past predicate adjective

Anata wa kirei deshita = You were beautiful

Nothing changes but the verb

Past modifier adjective

Anata wa kirei na hito deshita = You were beautiful person

Adjective kireina is modifying a noun hito (person). Therefore the **-na** is added.

Past negative adjective

Anata wa kirei dewa arimasendeshita = You were not beautiful

Nothing changes but the verb
